### I. INTRODUCTION

Child Nepal (CN) is a non-government organization working on child rights in general and child protection and child development in particular. It was established in 2003 by a group of social activists with an aim to initiate a child friendly culture with child neglect, corporal punishment, education and health as the major areas of interventions. CN is enshrined with UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) 1989 and Universal Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

#### **Vision**

CN envisions a Nepalese society where every child enjoys its rights as enshrined in UNCRC.

Initiating a child friendly culture.

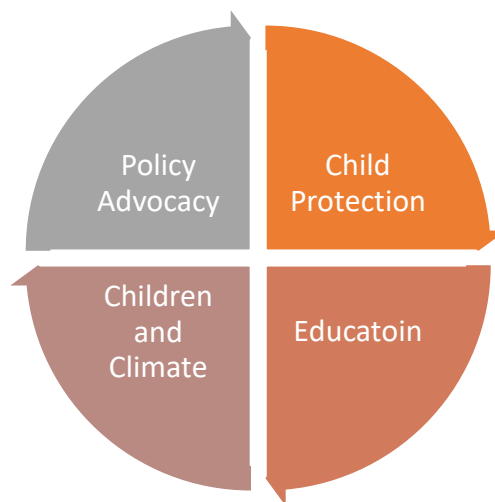
#### **Goal**
